More Crazy Patch with Attitude

Guest Barbara Randle, KP Publications Author of Crazy Quilting with an Attitude and More Crazy Quilting with an Attitude loves purses and her students and readers love seeing them! All the samples and instructions shown on the set are in her books. She brought a Foot Stool for the America Quilts creatively viewers.

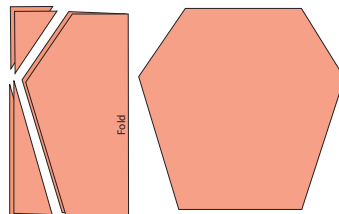
Here's how to make it!

1. Remove the screws to remove the original cover from the purchased stool. Use this as a pattern to cut your base fabric.

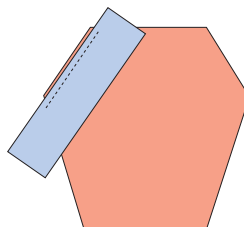
2. Cut a base for the crazy quilting from muslin.

3. Cut strips 3" wide from silk, upholstery fabrics, cottons or other specialty fabrics that catch your eye.

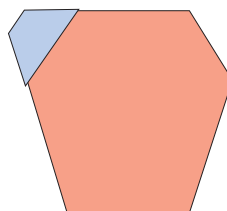
4. Cut a center piece about 5" square. Fold in half and cut off corners. Then cut off the other corners. Your center will end up like a house with skinny bottom as shown.



5. Start with the left "roof". Put the first strip there. Stitch in place. Trim, add the next piece. Continue adding the strips until your base is covered.



6. Now for the fun! Thread with decorative thread on top and sewing thread in the bobbin and stitch your crazy quilt decorative stitches along the seam lines.



7. To do bobbin work, wind a bobbin with YLI Candlelight thread. Place it in your Creative Bobbin Case. Practice on a scrap, adjusting the tension until you are happy with the stitching. Remember, the pretty stitching is on the underside of the fabric. When you are ready to stitch on your crazy quilt piece, work with the wrong side up. The stitching lines from

creating the patchwork give you a "map" to follow! Stitch along some of the lines.

8. You can also snap on your Couching/Braiding Foot and couch over candlelight and other decorative threads and yarns.

9. Place your crazy quilted cover on the stool and staple in place with a staple gun.

10. Glue braid around the edge of the stool.

Banner Printed Scarf

A favorite project of many sewers is to print using the banner printing process. The Silk Color Plus Fabric is perfect for scarves. It comes in either chiffon or crepe de chine.

You need banner printing software for your printer.

1. Open Microsoft Publisher.
2. Start a blank publication and choose banner.
3. Choose landscape, grab the rectangle tool, put square box around the banner.
4. Fill with color or texture.
5. Insert pictures on top of the background. Choose picture, insert, rotate, resize place as desired.
6. Continue inserting photos, until background is full.
7. Select print. In properties, choose banner paper 8 1/2" x 11" landscape, even though you will be printing on fabric.
8. Print.
9. Finish the edges of your scarf on your serger, with a rolled edge.

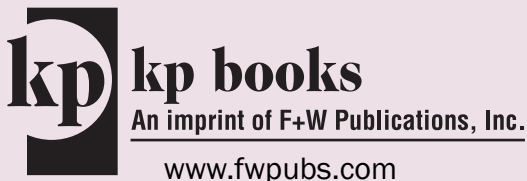

What's New to Do

Printed Block Bags

Guest, Andrea Poulimenos from Electric Quilt 5 brought cute, easy Printed Block Bags. It's a perfect way to join you passion for quilting with your passion for your family and favorite things!

1. In EQ5, Draw lines creating stick people. Draw hands, t-shirt, pants, feet, then color in clothing. Bring in the photo to the face area and move to "fussy" cut. Print out the pattern pieces and cut out and make block. Because it is an octagon, paper piecing is a good choice. Use the EQ Foundation Sheets for easy paper piecing
2. For purses, go through stash and use orphan blocks. Then create the same block with a picture for the front of the purse. Choose current fabrics from the library.
3. There are different types of printable fabrics. Satin weave fabric is a wearable-weight and is a good choice for durability. Cotton lawn is a lighter weight fabric and a good choice when you want to create old memory antique looks. Follow package instructions for printing and setting the color.
4. Then just peel off backing, sew into a quilt block.
5. You can also cut up pictures of things like flowers, door knobs, other things to create one of a kind patchwork.
