Quilts for your Windows

Pam Damour, representing the Warm Company joined Sue with great ideas for making insulated window shades from quilt tops! Many times you have blocks or quilt tops in your stash that have lost their appeal as a quilt, but may work perfectly as a window treatment. Or use quilt blocks to make a valance to hang over your existing window treatment.

Pam had a beautiful peach and green quilt top that was over 20 years old. It was the perfect color for her bathroom!

The Warm Window insulated shade system insulates your window at the same time as it adds a decorative focal point to your room.

All instructions are available at the store where you purchase your Warm Window supplies, and also on the Website, www.warmcompany.com

The shades feature a cord reel to store the cords safely from children or pets. When the shade is pulled up, just wrap and store in the cord reel.

The stitching lines in the Warm Window system make constructions easy. Magnetic strips in the side hems attach to the magnetic strips that you install on the sides of the window to ensure an insulated seal.

To create your Warm Windows, follow the manufacturer's instructions and substitute your quilt top for the outer fabric.

Memory Quilt Medallions

Andrea Poulimenos Bishop from Electric Quilt joined Sue, to teach about medallion quilts. Printing on Fabric is easy when the sheets are pretreated. It's just like printing on paper. Frame a quilt with borders and fabrics that enhance the colors of the photo to quickly create a personalized work of art.

Wander around your local quilt shop with your printed picture and you'd be amazed at how the colors just jump from the shelves and say, put me with your picture. The sea and beach colors in Owens's picture is complimented by the fabrics. The orange of the shirt, was picked up in the inner border.

The framing fabrics compliment the fall colors of the leaves and the sandy tones of Sedona's hair in the fabric printed picture.

When printing on fabric, use EQ Printables printer fabric. Use 150 to 300 dots per inch in resolution as you print. Different printer fabrics have different thread counts. The higher the thread count, the better the photo will print. Electric Quilt Lawn has a 240 thread count. Follow the instructions on the package to set the ink.
